



Survey Findings

Metastatic Breast Cancer Patients of Color Face Challenges Managing Chronic Conditions

The National Minority Quality Forum commissioned a survey to gather feedback from **black women with breast cancer age 18-29** diagnosed with metastatic breast cancer (mBC) on awareness and understanding of managing **mBC and comorbidities.**

Many respondents are managing chronic conditions like **diabetes**, **high blood pressure**, **and mental health concerns alongside their cancer treatments**. While most women report strong medication adherence and trust in their doctors, many still experience side effects and fear of missing doses.


